- 1. What needs to be included in my submission?
 - You must include the Testing Grant Billing Template in every submission.
 - If you are requesting reimbursement for PCR tests, all relevant invoices must be included.
- 2. What dates are eligible for grant reimbursement?
 - September 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. ALL expenditures MUST be incurred on or before June 30, 2021 to be eligible. OPB must receive reimbursement request by July 15, 2021.
- 3. How do I submit for December 31st, 2020 if I already submitted for the other days of that month?
 - If you want to just update the template for December, add the 31st, and then submit a request for the difference of December.
- 4. What makes a facility 'designated eligible'?
 - The Office of Planning and Budget identified eligible nursing home facilities based on Medicare/ Medicaid regulated facilities required to test in accordance with updated CMS guidance. The facilities list was identified based on those facilities identified as a nursing home on the Long-Term Care Facility COVID-19 Report published by the Department of Community Health on September 1, 2020.
- 5. If the Department of Health completed the testing at my facility, would that be eligible for reimbursement?
 - If the Department of Health charged the facility for the tests, then they would be eligible. If they did not, then those would be ineligible for reimbursement.
- 6. If the Antigen tests were donated to my facility, is that still eligible for the \$51.31 per test?
 - Yes, for the Antigen tests, the facility is being reimbursed as a laboratory for processing the
 tests. Therefore, the facility will be reimbursed at the flat rate of \$51.31 per test regardless
 of the origin of the test kit.
- 7. In reference to the Testing Grant Billing Template, can one be filled out for the duration of the eligibility period?
 - No, there needs to be one worksheet, per facility, per month.
