SUBJECT: Fiscal Note
Senate Bill 394 (LC 39 4859)

Dear Chairman Albers:

The bill would eliminate the alternative fueled vehicles fee administered by the Georgia Department of Revenue (DOR). This fee is currently due at the time of initial vehicle registration and annually at the time of registration renewal. Proof of payment would no longer be required when applying for an alternative fueled vehicle license plate.

As shown in **Table 1**, the estimate of collections in the FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report indicates that the elimination of this fee would result in revenue loss of approximately \$41 million in FY 2027. Funds collected annually from the alternative fueled vehicle fees are appropriated to the Transportation Trust Fund, which is managed by the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT).
